Additionally, some department has been provided with a computer and a portable/mounted LCD projector.

Fire extinguishers have been installed in college and students and staff have been trained in handling the equipment.

The management makes appointments through prescribed procedures. Orientation and training programmes are periodically organised for new recruits.

During Academic year 2012-13 although the grantable teaching posts were vacant, the institution could not get NOC from Government , so the institution recruited 02 faculties for grantable posts & 20 faculties are recruited on non grant basis .
