### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

**Library:** Networking has been installed in the library. New 38 reference as well as 755 text books are newly added in this year. Library with reading hall.

**ICT** - The ICT facilities and other learning resources are available in the institution for academic and administrative purposes. The staff and students have access to technology and information retrieval on current and relevant issues. Additionally, some department has been provided with a computer and a portable/mounted LCD projector.

#### **Physical Infrastructure/Instrumentation:**

Well furnished office, Seminar hall, classrooms, staff room, well equipped laboratories, library, Ladies' common room, parking area and 'Ladies hostel, Some halls have LCD and screen facilities. Notice boards have been installed in strategic locations in order to disseminate information relating to events, news, and other important information that every student needs to know. In order to ensure safety and security of the campus community, the College is under central surveillance with the installation of CCTVs at several locations on

campus. Fire extinguishers have been installed in college and students and staff have been trained in handling the equipment.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

At the end of each academic year the Management Committee reviews the existing positions and identifies personnel for various teaching and non-teaching positions. The management makes appointments through prescribed procedures. Orientation and training programmes are periodically organised for new recruits.

### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

**Recruitment Process:** The College follows a systematic Faculty Selection Process. Advertisement for the vacancies is published in leading local and national newspapers, after obtaining approval for posts from the Management and approval of the Roster from the university. Interviews of candidates and the selection process are carried out as per the university norms and guidelines.

During Academic year 2012-13 although the grantable teaching posts were vacant, the institution could not get NOC from Government, so 22 faculties are recruited on non grant basis.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- 1. We conduct various guest lecturers for the students to understand industrial needs. Experts from industry are invited to guide students.
- 2. Excursion tours of various departments are organized every year for industrial visits.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

The College follows Admission Procedure for students as follows:

- For UG & PG courses, students are admitted on merit basis. Applications are screened and Merit Lists are displayed on notices board.
- The College website, prospectus and handbook contain information about the institution and the programmes offered. The prospectus that highlights the details of various programmes of the College is prepared every year prior to the commencement of admissions. The prospectus also gives details of eligibility norms for admission. It is given to the applicants along with the application form.
- A customised admission software package has been developed to facilitate the admission process.

**2. salary bill calculation in Excel. In the next phase of training i.e. in summer, the Tally software training account section organized.

#### 5. Evidence of Success:

It has been observed that after training, non-teaching staff now interact with computer system confidently. They are now using computer for their daily work. Many of them have actively participated in training section. Account Department started computerized salary generation with use of sending emails to bank. Admission and exam section now effectively uses the Vriddhi Software for their daily uses.

# 6. Problems encountered and Resources required:

There are some challenging issues to motivate them for training. Some couldn't want to learn a new way, some members are afraid about English language.

- The teacher who was appointed for training was directed to be encouraging and supportive in his/her attitude while teaching.

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### **Best Practice II**

Title of the Practice: Remedial Coaching classes for slow learner students

#### Goal:

To bring backward class students those who are slow learners in to a stream of development with extra classes and study materials.

#### **The Context:**

Our college is situated in rural and hilly area. Due to inadequate facility students—suffer a lack of rudimentary knowledge of some subjects. It makes the teaching process difficult. Remedial coaching steps in to complement what they already know with what they should know.

Never the less this Remedial coaching facility has proved to be effective as it brought down the dropout rate quite encouragingly. It has also been observed that some students of our target communities have excelled in the University Examination. Besides it is also evident that a good number of students, who have got admitted to M.A., M.Com and M.Sc. Courses, as well as in industries, have been benefited from this course.

## **Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

This scheme was funded by the UGC so there is no issue related paucity of funds. The teachers who involved in the activity it is difficult for them to find the time apart from the regular teaching. As second thing is non availability of class room due to limited infrastructure.
